International Synchronized Skating Competition

The NSW Ice Skating Association is pleased to welcome entries for the first International Synchronized Skating Competition held in Australia.

1. General Regulations

Sydney Synchronized Festival will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2022, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2022, and the relevant ISU Communications, or any updates published by the date of the commencement of the event.

Participation in the Sydney Synchronized Festival is open to all Teams & Competitors who belong to an ISU Member and qualify with regard to eligibility according to the ISU Rules in effect. All participants' ages must fall within the limits specified in the ISU Rules and they must meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in the ISU Rules & Communications in effect or any updates published at the time of the commencement of the competition.

All Teams must be entered through their respective ISU Member Federation.

2. Categories

Sydney Synchronized Festival will offer the following divisions:

- ISU Senior: Short Program & Free Skating
- ISU Junior: Short Program & Free Skating
- ISU Advanced Novice: Free Skating
- Basic Novice A & B: Free Skating

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Technical Rules Synchronized Skating 2021, or any update to this document in effect by the date of the competition (Determination and publication of results) will be used.



3. Venue

The venue for this competition will be:

Ice Surface: 60 metres x 30 metres

The layout of the arena with the entrance to and exit from the ice, judges' stand, etc. will be forwarded to each participant following the close of entries.

Erina Ice Arena is located 1hr 30 mins North of the Sydney Airports.

4. Entries

Each ISU Member Association may enter any number of teams per category. The organiser reserves the right to limit the number of entries per Member. Entries of Teams, nominated Judges and Team Managers/Leaders may be made only by the Member Federation concerned on the designated Official Forms. All details must be completed and Team Managers must ensure all skaters and Teams meet all eligibility requirements at the time of entry.

All Entries must be sent to the Sydney Synchronized Festival 2022 Organizing Committee and submitted through the NSWISA Online Registration Platform.

All entries must be submitted BY FRIDAY 29TH JULY 2022.

All teams are requested to submit a team photo with their entry.

5. Entry Fees

The Entry Fees for this competition must be paid as part of the online registration process. The fees for each division are inclusive of GST and are:

ISU Senior: AUD \$1,900

ISU Junior: AUD \$1,900

ISU Advanced Novice: AUD \$1,500

Basic Novice A & B: AUD \$1,500

Please note the Entry Fee does not include any extra practice ice. Extra practice ice is available for purchase directly from Erina Ice Arena.

The costs of the meals, lodging and travel expenses will not be borne by the organization. Information about local accommodation, meal and transport services is available from the Organising Committee.

The entry fee will not be refunded in case of withdrawals for any reason.



6. Music & Planned Program Content

All teams shall provide their competition music of excellent quality in MP3 or Wav format, through the NSWISA Online Registration Portal. The team must also submit a copy of their music for each program at the time of registration. All USBs must be clearly identified with the name of the team, the category (Senior/Junior/Advanced Novice/Basic Novice), the type of program (Short Program/Free Skating) and must show the exact running time of the music (not skating time).

All Planned Program Content (PPC) information must also be submitted through the NSWISA Online Registration Portal at the time of entry. The PPC information must be completed by each Team using the terminology for the elements listed in the official ISU Scale of Values table.

Any updates of music or PPCs between the time of submission and the event must be communicated to admin@nswisa.com and nswisa@nswisa.com.

7. Accreditation

The official accreditation for Teams is planned at the Erina Ice Arena from the morning of Friday 26th August 2022. Accreditation for all Officials will be available from the morning of Thursday 25th August 2022, prior to the commencement of the ISU SYS Seminar.

Accreditation as a Team Member will be given to all entered Competitors and one Team Leader per participating team, two Coaches per Team, a maximum of two Team Officials of ISU Members and a maximum of two medical persons per ISU Member. Accreditation will only be granted to persons in those various functions if officially entered and named through their ISU Member. The ISU Member certifies with the signed entry form the indicated functions within the team of all team members.

Accreditation will be given to appointed Event Officials and Guests.

The national passport for each skater of the Teams taking part to the Competition will be required during the accreditation process.

In accordance with ISU Rule 109, all skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must have a release letter from the national federation they are a citizen of.

Please note that as per ISU Rule 830, after registration at accreditation for an event, Teams may not practice at a rink other than the official rink.

8. Official Practices

The Official Practices may start on Friday 26th August 2022. Each Team will be allocated Official Practices free of charge as follows:

- 10 minutes for all Short Programs and Novice Free Skating
- 11 minutes for the Junior Free Skating
- 12 minutes for the Senior Free Skating

No extra practice ice will be available after the Official Draw.



9. Draws

The Official Draw will be held at Erina Ice Arena at 5:00pm on Friday 26th August 2022. All Skaters, Coaches, Team Leaders and/or Managers, Officials & VIPs are invited to the draw.

For events with Short Program and Free Skating, the Free Skating will be skated in reverse order of the Short Program results.

10.Event Officials

Each participating Member may nominate judges for this event. Judges participating in the ISU SYS Seminar are also welcome to nominate to officiate at this competition. All Officials must be listed on the ISU List of Referees, Judges, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data & Replay Operators for Single & Pair Skating, Ice Dance and Synchronized Skating current at the time of the competition for the relevant role.

The Referees, Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers, Data and Replay Operators will be nominated by the Organizing Committee and chosen from the ISU list for Synchronized Skating however Officials are welcome to nominate to officiate at this event, particularly if they are attending the ISU SYS Seminar.

The Organiser will cover the travel expenses for invited Referees, Technical Specialists, Technical Controllers, Data and Replay Operators only. Ordered flight tickets should be based on economy airfare and approved by the Organising Committee. The Organiser will provide ground transportation for invited Technical Panel, Referees and nominated Judges. The expenses (room and meals) for invited Technical Panel, the Referees and nominated Judges will be borne by the Organiser starting with lunch Friday 26th August 2022 till lunch Sunday 28th August 2022. All other expenses shall be the responsibility of each official.

The Official Hotel will be advised to all Officials upon their nomination.

The Draw for the Panel of Judges will be done at the Judges Meeting, which will be held on Friday 26th August at 3:00pm at Erina Ice Arena.

The Judges Round Table Discussion will be held on Sunday 28th August following the competition for the ISU Events.

11.Technical Rules

Sydney Synchronized Festival 2022 will be run in accordance with appropriate ISU Rules (ISU General Regulations 2021 and ISU Special Regulations & Technical Rules for Synchronized Skating 2021), as well as all pertinent ISU Communications. Only those skaters whose names are listed on the registration form will be allowed to skate.

Age requirements are as per Rule 108, 4 ISU General Regulations.



The Technical Requirements for all divisions are as follows:

All divisions will run in accordance with the elements and requirements as listed in the ISU Rules and communications in effect for the 2022/23 season.

a) Senior Teams:

Shall consist of 16 skaters, who must have reached at least the age of 15 by 1st July 2022.

Short Program: Maximum 2 minutes 50 seconds, Factor 1.33

Free Skating Program: 4 minutes (\pm 10 seconds), Factor 2.67

b) Junior Teams:

Shall consist of 16 skaters, who must have reached at least the age of 13 but not have reached the age 19, by 1st July 2022.

Short Program: maximum 2 minutes 50 seconds, Factor 1.33

Free Skating Program: 3 minutes 30 seconds (\pm 10 seconds), Factor 2.67

c) Advanced Novice Teams:

Shall consist of 16 skaters, who must have reached the age of 10 and have not reached the age of 15, by 1st July 2022.

Free Skating Program: 3 minutes (\pm 10 seconds), Factor 2.67

d) Basic Novice A Teams:

Shall consist of 8-12 skaters, who must have reached the age of 10 and have not reached the age of 15, by 1st July 2022.

Free Skating Program: 3 minutes (\pm 10 seconds), Factor 2.67

e) Basic Novice B Teams:

Shall consist of 16 skaters, who must have reached the age of 10 and have not reached the age of 15, by 1st July 2022.

Free Skating Program: 3 minutes (\pm 10 seconds), Factor 2.67

For Basic Novice: If there are only a small number of competitors entered in both groups, we will form one "Basic Novice" group.

12. Opening Ceremony

The Opening Ceremony will be held at Erina Ice Arena prior to the commencement of competition on Saturday 27th August 2022.

13. Results

The IJS (ISU Judging System) will be used for all Divisions. Results displayed or announced will remain provisional until the results are certified by the segment Referee and Technical Controller on the official result form.

14. Awards

Medals will be presented to all registered skaters in each Team who place 1st, 2nd or 3rd. Certificates will be presented to all participating skaters.



15.Liability

In accordance with ISU Rule 119, ISA & NSWISA accept no liability for injury or damage sustained by competitors or officials. The Organizing Committee will not be providing participant insurance coverage for the event. Each Member is expected to provide its own insurance protection.

All members of Australian State Associations are covered under the ISA National Insurance Policy while participating in the event. This policy includes Sport Accident cover. ISA & NSWISA assume no responsibility for other persons in connection with this event. ISA recommends that any person travelling to an interstate event consider personal travel insurance.

It is the responsibility of all participants and accompanying persons to ensure they comply with all Australian and New South Wales Government requirements relating to Visas and Covid-19 travel restrictions. This competition will be run in adherence with all Government restrictions and requirements in force at the time of the event and the NSWISA COVID-19 Safety Plan.

16.Medical Information

The Organizing Committee will provide emergency medical services for all participants during the Official Practices and competition.

Each Team Manager should be able to give important medical information for each skater for use in case of an emergency or accident. Such information should include but is not limited to the following, and will greatly help local medical and emergency personnel:

- Allergies
- Existing medical conditions (eg. asthma)
- Current medications
- Immunizations
- Blood type
- Use of glasses, contact lenses, dental appliances, medical braces, etc.

17.Publicity Waiver

Each participant and Team, waive any and all rights to financial remuneration or other compensation for the use or reproduction of their image or likeness, or that of their Synchronized Skating Team, and grant permission to use same, as or in publicity prior to, during or following the Sydney Synchronized Festival 2022.

There will be an Official Photographer as well as representatives of the Organising Committee present at the event to capture photos. Photos taken by the Official Photographer will be available for viewing and purchase.

All private photographers and videographers are required to register at the Information / Registration desk on the day of the event. Please note that no flash photography or lights on cameras are permitted in practices, warm-ups or events, as it may be dangerous to the skaters.

The competition will be live-streamed and available on the NSWISA YouTube Channel.
